(January 28, 2026) — The American Truck Historical Society (ATHS) has opened applications for its annual educational scholarship program, continuing its long-standing commitment to supporting trucking families and the future of the industry. The ATHS Scholarship Program provides financial assistance to students pursuing education while honoring the legacy, hard work, and values that have powered trucking generations.

Applications are now being accepted for the following scholarships:

- The George Schroyer Memorial Scholarship provides two annual \$3,000 scholarships for ATHS members and immediate family members. This scholarship is sponsored by ATHS donors.
- The Cummins Scholarship offers one \$3,000 annual award for ATHS members and immediate family members. This scholarship is sponsored by Cummins.
- The Louis Semple Clarke Educational fund offers one \$3,000 annual award for Autocar Company employees and immediate family members. This scholarship, sponsored by Autocar, LLC and the ATHS Autocar Division Chapter honors Autocar Company founder Louis Semple Clarke.

These scholarships are available to graduating high school seniors or undergraduates pursuing further education at an accredited two-year or four-year U.S. college or university, or a vocational/technical school. Students must maintain a minimum 3.0 GPA. Previous scholarship recipients who meet the program criteria may apply. Preference for all scholarships will be given to applicants pursuing careers in the trucking or transportation industry. Financial need, community service, and extracurricular activities will also be considered.

"ATHS members are encouraged to share this opportunity with their families and help drive the next generation toward success," said ATHS Executive Director John Gravley. "ATHS scholarships are a valuable benefit of membership. Any member in good standing for at least two years, as well as immediate family members, is eligible to apply."
